

# Bulletin 2022-6 Issued September 28, 2022 Effective January 1, 2023

## 2023 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Less Food and Energy

### Introduction

The State of Rhode Island Office of the Health Insurance Commissioner issues this bulletin for the purpose of determining the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): Less Food and Energy for calendar year 2023. This determination of the CPI-U Less Food and Energy is made pursuant to <a href="mailto:230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(2)">230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(2)</a> and <a href="mailto:230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(6)">230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(6)</a>.

The CPI-U Less Food and Energy percentage increase identified below must be used by commercial health insurers in connection with maximum, annual hospital rate increases (230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(6)(e)(1)) and in connection with maximum, annual increases for population-based contracts (230-RICR-20-30-4.10(D)(2)(f)). Additionally, the terms in this bulletin shall have the meaning of those terms as defined in 230-RICR-20-30-4.

## 2023 CPI-U: Less Food and Energy

For calendar year 2023, the CPI-U Less Food and Energy percentage increase shall be 6.3%. This figure is based on the most recently published 12-month percentage change in the CPI-U Less Food and Energy by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (August 2022). The reference series ID is CUUR0000SA0L1E.

### **Hospital Contracts**

In connection with maximum, annual hospital rate increases, the contractual rate of increase shall be no more than 7.3% during the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

## **Population-Based Contracts**

In connection with maximum, annual increases for population-based contracts, the contractual rate of increase shall be no more than 7.8% during the period January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

#### Conclusion

This bulletin shall take effect on January 1, 2023.
